

In my home, we have rules that everyone is expected to follow. For example, some of our rules are 'wash your hands before you eat', 'if you don't like dinner, make your own' and 'always use your manners'. I'm sure you have certain rules in your home that help everyone to get along and be healthy and safe. Can you think of anywhere else we have rules? Places like school, public pool, libraries. We also have lots of rules where we live. Things like speed limits, curfews and where to cross the street.

It seems like there are rules everywhere! Why do you think we have so many rules we have to follow? Rules help us get along nicely with one another and to stay healthy, safe, and happy.

Did you know God has rules too? The Bible is full of instructions on how to live our best, most loving lives. These instructions are often called laws. There are ten laws in particular that we are going to focus on. You may know them better as the Ten Commandments. In case you can't remember them all, let's go over them. (Also this is a great time to memorize them for some Kingdom Cash) But first, the story about where they came from:

It had been three months since the Israelites left Egypt, and they set up camp at the foot of Mt. Sinai. God called to Moses from the mountain, and Moses went up to Him. God reminded Moses of how He freed the Israelites from Pharaoh, and how the devastation in Egypt demonstrated His power and might. Then God told Moses that if the people obey His covenants, their nation would be great and holy in His sight. Then He told Moses to have the people cleanse themselves and be ready, because in three days the Lord will come down on the mountain. The people should not attempt to go up or even touch the mountain.

So on the third day, there was thunder and lightning with a loud trumpet blast. The mountain was covered with a thick cloud of smoke, because the Lord came onto it with fire. The whole mountain trembled and all the people were afraid. No one was allowed to go to the mountain except Moses. This was the time that God gave Moses the Ten Commandments.

- 1. You shall have no other gods before Me.
- 2. You shall not make idols.
- 3. You shall not take the name of the LORD your God in vain.
- 4. Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy.
- 5. Honor your father and your mother.
- 6. You shall not murder.
- 7. You shall not commit adultery.
- 8. You shall not steal.
- 9. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.
- 10. You shall not covet.

Today I want to focus on the importance of following the rules. Do you remember why we follow rules? Because rules help us get along nicely with one another and to stay healthy, safe, and happy.

There is one very important thing to remember, though. We are not saved by following the Ten Commandments. Following the law is not how we get to heaven. The only way to live forever in heaven with Jesus is by trusting Him.

Isn't that GREAT news? I know I could never follow all the rules, just right, all the time, for my whole life. And thank God, I don't have to. All I have to do is believe that Jesus died on the cross for my sins and now lives in my heart. Ephesians 2:8-9 reminds us:

"God saved you by his grace when you believed. And you can't take credit for this; it is a gift from God. Salvation is not a reward for the good things we have done, so none of us can boast about it."

So that brings up a question. Do we have to follow the Ten Commandments, or not? Well, to tell you the truth, this is something smart people have been discussing for a long, long time, and they don't always agree. Some people say yes, we must follow the law, and some people say no, we don't.

Here's what I think: yes, and no. As we learn from the Bible, the law cannot make us right with God. Only our faith in Jesus can do that. God won't love you more if you follow all the Ten Commandments, and He won't love you less if you don't. God's love for you will never, ever change. God will always, always, ALWAYS love you, no matter what you do.

So no, we don't have to follow the rules to be loved by God. But yes, following the Ten Commandments will help us live the life God has planned for us.

Following God's commands helps us to love Him better and love each other better.






